The SU Ag camp at Lostock was held for the first time last April, with a view to an ag camp being held every Easter holidays. This year was a very small camp – because it was new. Next year the aim is to hold a camp firstly for boys aged between 11 and 16 and then straight after, a girls camp. This camp will be advertised through SU, ANew Church at New Lambton and locally. Each camp would be aiming to host 30 to 40 young people. There would be very little involvement from the incumbent, however the hope would be that the incumbent could come to a planning meeting and visit the camp when it is on.

PC would like to explore the possibility of closing centres down, due to not being able to afford full time ministry and the fact that insurance costs are crippling the Parish.
